Litter Bin in Ayton Road Layby




The new litter bin has now been installed in the Ayton Road layby. The bin will be emptied twice per week by North Yorkshire Council, along with the other dog waste and litter bins within the community.

Additional Dog Waste Bin

Residents have expressed interest in adding another dog waste bin at the end of Main Street, at the junction with Goose Mire Lane. This is a popular area for dog walking. Initial enquiries indicate that North Yorkshire Council would be able to service a bin in this location. Purchase of a bin will be discussed at the upcoming Council meeting.

Potential Land Redevelopment

North Yorkshire Council has made a public release of 'Call for Sites' submissions. Four large parcels of land in Irton have been submitted by landowners for consideration for potential redevelopment. Two sites border on Main Street, with the other two bordering on Ayton Road across from the layby. Community consultation has not begun; however, the Council will continue to monitor this process.
